Our school is situated 15 minutes' walk from Hankyu Minoh station and 20 minutes' walk from Minoh-Kayano station in the north of Osaka. It is a Catholic school and part of a network that covers 33 countries worldwide. Originally a girls' school, it has been co-ed since 2017 when the immersion program was launched. Students have the option to study in the immersion program or not. Immersion junior high school students have homeroom, mathematics, science, music and English classes conducted in English, with the rest of their classes take in Japanese. Senior high school students have slightly different courses.
